Dear Friends of IPM,

As we correspond with inmates every week, many share with us their prayer requests. Christopher T., from a California prison recently wrote: "My prayer request is for me and my brothers in Christ at this facility. That we may endure in strength to do God's will so that the genuineness of our faith may be found to praise, honor and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ."

What a great prayer! And what a godly, biblical example for all of us. It takes much strength to run the Christian race of life. Relying upon our own resources, we will not make it very far. Praise the Lord, He is ever available to offer the strength that is needed. "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of His might...I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me...But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength" (Ephesians 6:10; Philippians 4:13; Isaiah 40:31).

It also takes much endurance to withstand the constant onslaught of the world, the flesh, and the devil. The scriptures offer us hope for enduring and holding fast to the Lord.
