Dear Friends of IPM,

This month we enter into another new year. It is a good time to reflect on the newness Jesus brings into the lives of those who trust in Him. We recently received a letter from Danny S., from a California prison: "I read your booklet, <u>The</u> <u>Story of Jesus</u>, and I wanna know more about Jesus and this new life He gives."



# Prisoners in the Bible

"Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them" Acts 16:25

Chaplain Howard called the Bible the "Prisoner's Book" because there are so many prisoners mentioned in the Bible. Those prisoners have so much to say to inmates today. There are many prisoners mentioned from Genesis with Joseph spending his entire adult life in Egypt, to Revelation with John on the island of Patmos as a prisoner of the Romans.

Today there are also "spiritual prisoners." They are the person, whether inside or outside prison walls, who are locked in or controlled by their sinful way of thinking and selfish manner of living. Jesus spoke of persons who were "children of your father, the devil" because of their conduct. Paul wrote of those who were "slaves to sin." If you are a spiritual prisoner, this book can help you to be set free. This book shares the Good News of how prisoners during Bible times experienced the love and forgiveness of God and a new life. Their faith in God gave them not only courage for what they faced, but a bright hope for tomorrow, because they believed in a life that was eternal.
