Dear Friends of IPM,

The Scriptures clearly invite us to live day by day through Christ sharing His life in us. We recently received a letter from Lenny V., in a California prison. Lenny wrote: "I have given it all to my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me."

No longer us, but Christ. What an astounding truth to embrace. "I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh (in this body) I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me" (Galatians 2:20). We are not the ones producing our Christian life: "It is no longer I who live." This reality is radically contrary to man's natural thinking. If we are not to manufacture our life with God, what other option could possibly be available? The wonderful answer is: "Christ lives in me." True Christian living is to be Christ living in and through our lives.

God has placed extraordinary heavenly treasure in ordinary earthen vessels. "But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellency of the power may be of God, and not of us...Christ in you, the hope of glory" (2 Corinthians 4:7; Colossians 1:27). The Lord is the treasure in the clay pot of our redeemed humanity. He is to be the excellent power in our lives. He is the One we are to trust in and draw upon as our strength for daily living. He is to be the One receiving the glory as His life is expressed through us.

A beautiful picture of this truth is described in the Gospel of John. "I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much

fruit: for without me ye can do nothing" (John 15:5). Just like the vine to a branch, the Lord makes His life available to us that His life might be expressed through our lives. The Lord Jesus wants to live in and through the lives of His disciples as we daily put our faith in Him and draw upon His resources. He wants us to live by humbly depending on His shared life freely provided.

Like Lenny, in a California prison, may we come to embrace the truth that it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in us. We praise the Lord for all who faithfully partner with us as we share God's love and truth with needy souls behind bars.


### From Crime to Christ

Motivated by his love for Christ and the call of God on his life, "Chaplain" Al Gibbons spent more than a decade sharing the glorious gospel of Jesus Christ with Texas inmates. With few resources, other than the prayers of his friends, Al traversed the backroads and highways of Texas heading for various penitentiaries.

The mission was difficult. He often received less than enthusiastic reception from prison officials. They questioned why they should allow a layman with no credentials into secure cellblocks. Al committed his ways to the Lord. When the prison doors finally opened to him, he saw very little response from the inmates. Al wondered if he was missing God's will for his life. Despite the doubts, he persevered.

In time his devotion to Christ and his love for the inmates became apparent to the entire prison community. He would visit each cell, pray for the prisoners and call them to commit their lives fully to Christ. This book contains stories of several inmates who received God's goodness and mercy through the ministry of Al Gibbons.
